Documents Checklist

1. Basic Documents:

- a. Application form completed online (should be printed-out and signed);
- b. Original passport and copy of the information page;
- c. 2 photo of the applicant;
- d. Certificate of visa in Australia (for citizens of other countries who are in Australia);
- e. Original and Photocopy of previous Chinese passports and previous Chinese visas (applicable for those who were Chinese citizens and have obtained foreign citizenship).

If you are applying for a Chinese visa for the first time, you are required to provide the last Chinese passport held, a photocopy of its data page and first Australian/other country's permanent resident visa.

If you have obtained Chinese visas before and apply for a Chinese visa with a renewed foreign passport that does not contain any Chinese visa, you are required to present the photocopy of the previous passport's data page and the photo page if it is separate, as well as the previous Chinese visa page (If your name on the current passport differs from that on the previous one, you must provide an official document of name change).

f. Certificate of COVID-19 vaccination showing at least 2 shots (for applicants of 5 years old and over);

2. Supporting Documents

Besides the basic documents (a-f), you should also provide the supporting materials based on the type of visa you are applying for. Materials for different visas are as follows:
